### **4. Secretary's Report**

"Following on from the ballot I was asked to hold because of the new conditions laid down by the Oriental Club, here are the plans for the beginning of next year:

We follow the majority decision to meet twice a month starting January as follows.

January 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>  
February 12<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.

We will post the cancelled dates on the web site and the District Bulletin

We will charge £28, the £3 surcharge will cover speakers' meals and possible bills for less than 10 meals.

Visitors will be charged £25.

Speakers will be on January 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> and February 26<sup>th</sup>. Margaret Pollock has offered to organise an event for February 12<sup>th</sup>. We won't cancel any meetings to which we have invited a speaker.

Council meetings will be on 29<sup>th</sup> January and February 26<sup>th</sup> at 11am so it won't be a problem if it is on the same day as a speaker.

Looking for a new venue has been placed on the agenda for the next Council meeting. ( A new venue may of course allow us to change our timetable if we so choose.)

March meetings will be March 15<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> at least.

As President- Elect I ask you all to accept the decision of the majority and unite with the common purpose of building up the Club for the future. Otherwise I think there is a real danger I won't have a club of which to be President.

### **4. Speaker**

Tom Lester introduced our guest speaker Kat Pugh, the Head teacher of St Marylebone CE School. Kat said that she was very pleased to speak to us. She never had a lunch break; at school there was a myriad of activities now taking place. both intellectual physical . It was clear that the School was very active and engaged with the students..



Kat talked about the publications the school produces.: there was a weekly Bulletin prepared by the students and a very glossy St Marylebone Messenger, produced twice a year with articles by students.

Kat told us the School was founded in 1791, originally the Marylebone "Day School of Industry", to educate the children of the poor in the parish. The St Marylebone School was a comprehensive school and was one of the first arts specialist schools. It focused on the visual and performing arts as well as doing extremely well in the Sciences and Maths. There were 1098 pupils with girls from 11-16 and the sixth form with both boys and girls. The School had an environment that supported students' accomplishments and high achievement, and there was a 'Praise Board' to recognise achievement, and this was supported by all students. There was a very culturally rich educational environment. They had a very high and varied number of speakers talking about their careers and the working world.

Kat also spoke about the relationship with the Marylebone Hotels consortium, through the good offices of Margaret Pollock. The Hotel sponsored a fun raising event for the school last year which had raised £20,000 for the school.

Questions ranged from the use of mobile phones to the various Rotary contacts and competitions engaged in by the School.

Tom thanked Kat for an inspirational talk.

## 5. Visits to other Clubs etc.

Tom Lester had visited the meeting of the Westminster area clubs. He was impressed at the work the clubs do for the community. He said there were 50 members in attendance. He presented our projects at the meeting and encouraged our members to visit the other clubs from time to time.

## 6. Christmas Lunch

Carole Harris reviewed the plans for the Club Christmas lunch to be held at the Oriental Club on Monday December 4<sup>th</sup>. Tickets were £40 with drinks starting at 12 noon with lunch beginning at 12:45. Please get your cheques to Carole as soon as possible.

John Bash asked that Members send him the cheques and counterfoils or bring them to next week's meeting. **This is very important. Most Members have not yet done this** as the last date for handing them to John in time to partake in the draw was 24 November.
